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OIG RELEASES 2018 STRATEGIC PLAN

The New Orleans Office of Inspector General today released its [Strategic Plan 2018](#) to communicate OIG priorities and strategies to the public, the Ethics Review Board, and City officials.

In its risk assessment to guide the OIG in its selection of projects and priorities, the OIG identified Louis Armstrong New Orleans International Airport and the New Orleans Police Department as most improved city entities. The plan called the Sewerage and Water Board the worst government entity that Inspector General Ed Quatrevaux has encountered in 40 years as a government manager.

The IG credited the Landrieu Administration for greatly improving the City's administrative processes, financial management, and transparency of procurement of professional services.

"The OIG has reviewed more than 100 procurement solicitations every year of this Administration, and does not believe there is a serious risk of fraud as long as the City continues to maintain openness in the process," stated Quatrevaux.

The OIG's list of activities underway or projected to begin in 2018 include an audit of NOPD crime reporting accuracy for sex crimes/aggravated assault, as well as audits of S&WB billing and collections, inventory, and payroll. An evaluation of automated traffic enforcement and audits of the Audubon Commission and Audubon Nature Institute are also underway. The OIG also plans continued funding evaluations of justice system entities.
