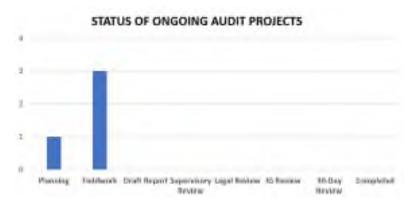

AUDIT & REVIEW DIVISION

The **Audit and Review Division** conducts financial audits, attestations, compliance, and performance audits of City programs and operations. Auditors test for appropriate internal controls and compliance with laws, regulations, and other requirements.

INVESTIGATION DIVISION

Mayor Cantrell, former NOPD officer Vappie charged in superseding indictment

On Aug. 15, the U.S. Attorney's Office, Eastern District of Louisiana, announced an 18-count superseding indictment for conspiracy to commit wire fraud, wire fraud, conspiracy to obstruct justice, obstruction of justice, and making false declarations before a grand jury against **New Orleans Mayor LaToya Cantrell** and her former bodyguard, **Jeffrey Vappie**.

Cantrell and Vappie are scheduled for a Sept. 10 arraignment in federal court.

Cantrell faces nearly a dozen felony counts in the indictment, which alleges she and Vappie perpetrated a yearslong scheme to defraud the City of New Orleans and New Orleans Police Department (NOPD) by exploiting their positions with the City for personal gain. The indictment accuses Cantrell and Vappie of employing various tactics, including deleting evidence and making false statements to federal agents and/or a grand jury, to continue and conceal their scheme.

Vappie, a former NOPD officer, was initially indicted in July 2024 on federal charges of wire fraud. He now faces additional counts of wire fraud as well as charges of conspiracy. His trial is scheduled for December 2025, but his trial date is subject to change due to the superseding indictment.

The indictment is the result of collaboration among the New Orleans OIG, the U.S. Attorney's Office, Eastern District of Louisiana, the FBI New Orleans Field Office, and the Metropolitan Crime Commission of New Orleans. The U.S. Attorney's Office recognized the contributions of the OIG in a press release and press conference announcing the superseding indictment.

OTHER ONGOING PROSECUTIONS:

The Investigation Division also continues to assist in the criminal prosecutions of Leessa Augustine, Tyrell Morris, Gabriel Thomas, and Michael Willis Jr.

Augustine, a former New Orleans SWBNO Senior Special Agent and reserve NOPD officer, pled guilty June 11 to two counts of wire fraud relating to an emergency benefit, one count of wire fraud affecting a financial institution, and one count of making false statements to investigators. Her sentencing is set for Sept. 16, 2025.

Morris, former Executive Director of the Orleans Parish Communication District (OPCD), was indicted on charges of insurance fraud, malfeasance in office, impersonation of a police officer, and second-degree injuring of public records. Morris' trial date, scheduled for August, was moved to Sept. 22, 2025.

INVESTIGATION DIVISION

(ONGOING PROSECUTIONS CONTINUED)

Thomas, a former SWBNO employee, was arrested by Louisiana State Police's Troop NOLA last December as part of a joint investigation into brass and copper thefts from SWBNO. Thomas' motions hearings were concluded in August pending his trial date.

Willis, a former City of New Orleans tow truck driver, was arrested by Louisiana State Police in late July as part of a joint investigation by the OIG and Louisiana State Police Troop NOLA. The investigation revealed Willis was bypassing the official tow process by accepting cash payments in exchange for not towing vehicles. He was arrested by State Police on charges of malfeasance in office, obstruction of justice, and injuring public records.

An indictment is merely a charge and the guilt of the defendant must be proven beyond a reasonable doubt.

Report on Department of Safety & Permits to be released

The OIG's Department of Safety & Permits (S&P) Review is set for release in September. The report contains findings and recommendations resulting from an extensive review of the agency's policies, procedures, and internal controls. The OIG conducted the review, which involved embedding OIG staff at S&P, with a focus on identifying and mitigating inefficiencies at this critical agency.

The OIG initiated the review of S&P following multiple instances of fraud, waste, abuse, and mismanagement within S&P. Investigations into these instances by the OIG and partnering agencies led to the arrest, indictment, termination, and/or resignation under investigation of multiple S&P employees. These repeated instances point to ineffective operations at a systemic level, which created opportunities for corruption. The report includes recommendations for reforming S&P to ensure efficient and effective services for the citizens of New Orleans.

BY THE NUMBERS

During **August**, the Investigation Division received 14 complaints, opened two investigations, and served four requests for documentation.

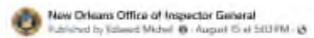

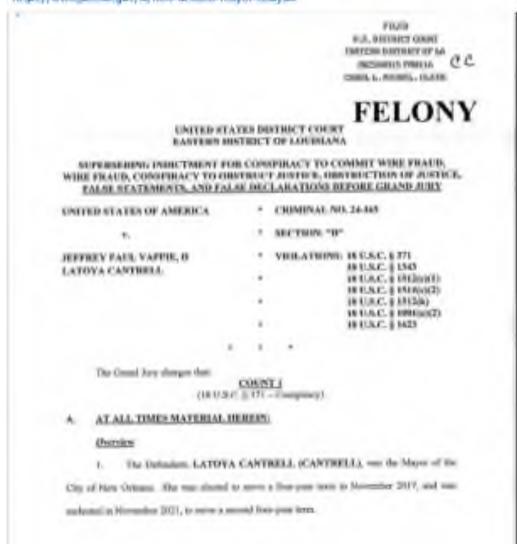
Today, the U.S. Attorney's Office. Eastern District of Louisiana, announced a superseding indictment for conspiracy to commit wire fraud, wire fraud, corepiracy to obstruct justice, obstruction of justics, and making false declarations before a grand jury against New Orleans Mayor LaToya.

The indictment also includes additional charges against Cantrell's former bodyquard and NOPD. offices: Jeffrey Vappie, originally indicted in July 2024.

Today's indictment is the result of collaboration among the New Orleans OlG, the U.S. Attorney's Office, Eastern District of Louisiana, FBI - New Orleans, and the Metropulities Office Commission of New Orleans.

Inspector General Ed Michel stated: "The Office of Inspector General will continue to combine our resources with those of our federal and initial partners to ensure integrity in City government."

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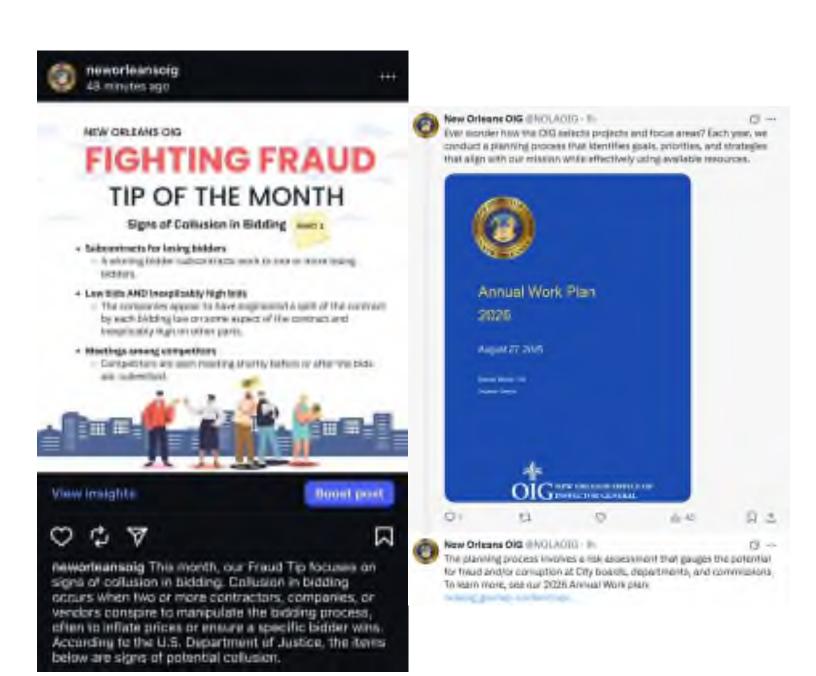
