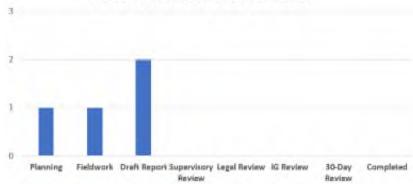

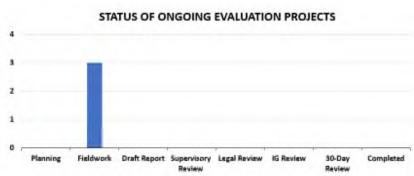

INVESTIGATION DIVISION

ONGOING PROSECUTIONS:

The Investigation Division continues to assist in the criminal prosecutions of Mayor LaToya Cantrell and Jeffrey Vappie, Tyrell Morris, Leessa Augustine, Gabriel Thomas, and Michael Willis Jr.

A new trial date has been set for **Cantrell** and **Vappie** after each pled not guilty during September arraignments in federal court. A new trial date for both has been set for October 2026. The new date was set following an Aug. 15 superseding indictment for conspiracy to commit wire fraud, wire fraud, conspiracy to obstruct justice, obstruction of justice, and making false declarations before a grand jury against Cantrell and her former bodyguard.

The 18-count indictment alleges Cantrell and Vappie perpetrated a yearslong scheme to defraud the City of New Orleans and New Orleans Police Department (NOPD) by exploiting their positions with the City for personal gain. The indictment was the result of collaboration among the New Orleans OIG, the U.S. Attorney's Office, Eastern District of Louisiana, the FBI New Orleans Field Office, and the Metropolitan Crime Commission of New Orleans.

Morris, former Executive Director of the Orleans Parish Communication District (OPCD), was convicted Sept. 26 on all charges against him, including insurance fraud, malfeasance in office, impersonation of a police officer, and second-degree injuring of public records. Morris's sentencing is set for Oct. 2, 2025.

Augustine, a former New Orleans SWBNO Senior Special Agent and reserve NOPD officer, pled guilty June 11 to two counts of wire fraud relating to an emergency benefit, one count of wire fraud affecting a financial institution, and one count of making false statements to investigators. Her sentencing, formerly set for September, has been pushed to Oct. 14, 2025.

Thomas, a former SWBNO employee, was arrested by Louisiana State Police's Troop NOLA last December as part of a joint investigation into brass and copper thefts from SWBNO. Thomas' motions hearings were concluded in August pending his trial date.

Willis, a former City of New Orleans tow truck driver, was booked Sept. 26 with additional charges of obstruction of justice, malfeasance in office, and injuring public records as part of an ongoing joint investigation by the OIG and Louisiana State Police Troop NOLA. Louisiana State Police first arrested Willis in late July after the joint investigation revealed Willis was bypassing the official tow process by accepting cash payments in exchange for not towing vehicles.

An indictment is merely a charge and the guilt of the defendant must be proven beyond a reasonable doubt.

INVESTIGATION DIVISION

Department of Safety & Permits report to be released

The OIG's Department of Safety & Permits (S&P) Review is set for release. The report contains observations and recommendations resulting from an extensive review of the agency's policies, procedures, and internal controls. The OIG conducted the review, which involved embedding OIG staff at S&P, with a focus on identifying and mitigating inefficiencies at this critical agency.

The OIG initiated the review of S&P following multiple instances of fraud, waste, abuse, and mismanagement within S&P. Investigations into these instances by the OIG and partnering agencies led to the arrest, indictment, termination, and/or resignation under investigation of multiple S&P employees. These repeated instances point to ineffective operations at a systemic level, which created opportunities for corruption. The report includes recommendations for reforming S&P to ensure efficient and effective services for the citizens of New Orleans.

BY THE NUMBERS

As of **Sept. 15**, the Investigation Division had received 9 complaints and served 4 requests for documentation.

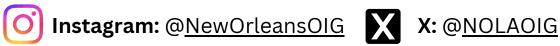

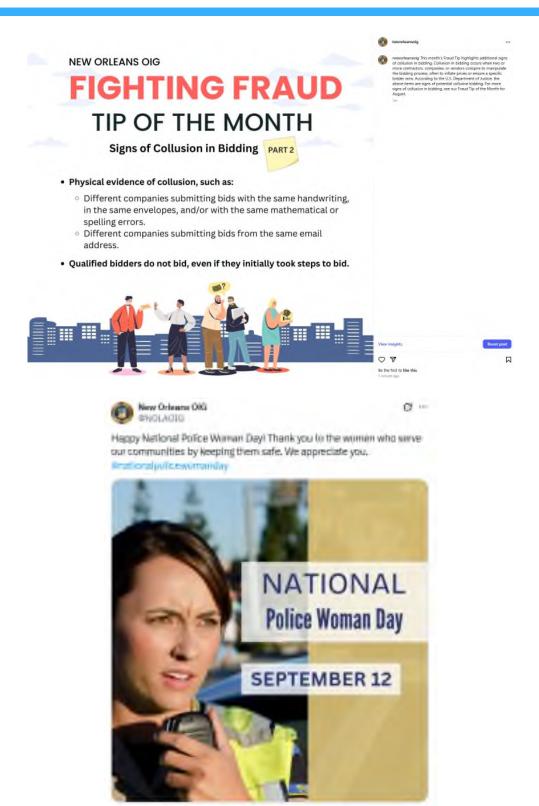
